"The Process"

Recently, the garage door opener at our house needed to be replaced. After spending more time than is reasonable researching openers and reading way too many customer reviews, I obtained a new one. It arrived Friday afternoon and I quickly got to work installing it. I opened the box and started pulling out parts bags, unwrapping items, assembling pieces, discarding others....just generally figuring it out.

After about 30 minutes I was starting to feel like I was in over my head. I took out the directions and realized I hadn't begun at step 1. The instructions laid out a specific, step-by-step process for installation--a system specially designed to get me to the goal in as efficient way as possible. Yet instead, I just started at about step 4 and couldn't figure out why I wasn't making any progress.

I like systems and process – they make sense to me because they are linear, sequential. You start here, you do this, you go here next, and eventually, after following the directions, you get your desired result. We follow systems in recipes, building projects, even getting ready in the morning. In fact, most of our day is ordered by a system or process whether we know it or not.

Last fall our Church Administrative Board asked the question: "What is our process for 'making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world'?" (Hopefully you recognize this as our mission statement). After some discussion, we have been working to develop what the discipleship/faith development process looks like.

On the next page is a matrix we developed for this process. On the left side of the matrix are the different stages of our faith (these correspond with the stages of grace we discussed in August). Across the top are the movements of faith we have been discussing in worship throughout September. If you look at the bottom row – it describes the actions/activities of someone who is committed and working on growing and maturing in their faith – someone who embodies becoming a disciple. The row row describes ways to get started in each of those areas, and the middle rows describe how to begin moving to a deeper commitment.

It is my hope that you will take some time to look over this table and consider where you are and where you want to be. Spend some time thinking and praying about how you might take a step further into one or more of these areas. Our goal is to become fully formed disciples of Jesus Christ. It is my prayer, and that of our church leaders, that this process will help us all understand better how to accomplish that goal.

Board Update - Plumbing Recovery

#### To the Congregation:

As many of you know, we recently had a water event at the church, which sent hundreds of gallons of water flowing peacefully through our office, down the stairs, and into our basement. With God's grace, it was noticed relatively soon after it had begun, and an incredible series of events began.

Stalwart members of our church, Elvin Farquhar and Linda Gordon after finding this, began to make calls to myself, Pastor Chris, and ServePro to begin reclamation and mitigation efforts. They were joined by myself, Bill Salyer, and Larry Schler. ServePro sent nearly a dozen people and several vehicles.

After removing the water, setting 62 fans and several dehumidifiers throughout the church, the real work of assessing the damage began. Flooring in at least three rooms had to come up and more to follow. The children's chapel, lounge, and hall bathroom, were joined by the Sunday school classrooms with extensive water damage to both floor and furniture.

These issues are almost always better, as bad and worse than they seem all at the same time. Our insurance carrier, Brotherhood Mutual sent an adjuster to assess our losses. Through a complicated formula of actual loss, depreciation and good will, they arrived at a figure to help compensate the loss. We broke just even on this event after paying for the services and replacement of critical items. We were truly blessed it was not worse and even more so that no one was hurt at any point during or after.


All this while learning that our air conditioning units are all woefully out of date; no longer serviceable; and must be replaced before one calendar year passes.

In the upcoming days we will be making difficult decisions about the infrastructure of our church building, and trying to provide for long overdue and necessary improvements. We, the board, very humbly ask that you pray about how best to assist us in these endeavors.
