"Money"

I've been thinking about money a lot lately. (I recognize this is a strange statement.) However, I just finished up a 7-week course on financial resource development and next week I begin a new 7-week course on financial resource management. In addition to this, the church has had or is facing some large expenses that are on the forefront of my mind. In addition to this, of course, it is tax season, which always seems to make me nervous that some mistake will be discovered and suddenly we will owe the government ridiculous amounts of money.

In the class I just finished, each week focused on our relationship with and attitude toward money. In my family growing up, money was a topic we never discussed. I never knew how much money my parents earned, how much bills were, how much was spent on vehicles (only that Dad negotiated a great deal), or how much money my parents gave to the church. I knew an envelope was placed in the plate regularly, but the amount was never disclosed.

In the church I grew up in, it felt like money was a similarly taboo topic. Members accepted that each fall a sermon or two might address giving to the church as part of the annual stewardship drive, but beyond that, no one talked about money as a matter of faith. The message was basically, "the church needs money, and the members are responsible for giving it."

These monetary principals mirrored my own attitude toward giving for many years. I remember as a kid not understanding why Dad gave me a quarter every week to put in the plate at Sunday School. Later, when I started earning my own money, I felt very grown up when I would put a dollar or two in the plate, thinking I was doing my duty. Once Sara and I were married, she made it clear that we would tithe. Suddenly, right after I got a real job making real money, I was giving away nearly \$300 a month. I went along with this because I knew it was the right thing to do, but I didn't like it. Each year when we received our giving statement, I would look at the total and think about what I/we could have done (meaning bought) with that money.

Over time, my attitude has changed. Now, when I see our giving statements, I don't look at the vacation we could have taken or the shiny toys we could have bought. Now I think about the kids who went to camp, the people who received diapers or groceries or even heat, the Angel Tree luncheon and Youth lock-in and fellowship meals, and the many contributions this congregation has made to our community through our giving. I have come to see that God has done more through me giving him my money than what I could or would have done myself. The things God does with our financial gifts are so much more important and eternal than anything we could do with the same funds.

I write this not with the end goal of asking you for money, but asking you to think about your attitude toward giving. When you give to the church, is to help us pay our bills, or to be a part of the work God is doing? Do you give because you think you are supposed to, or out of gratitude to God for all that God has done for you? Our attitude toward money and giving matters, maybe even more than the dollar amount we give. I encourage you to spend some time thinking not just about the amount you give, but why and in what spirit. Remember, we are told "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

Greetings from Your Administrative Board:

Thank you so much for your patience and understanding during our recent electrical issues. We are feeling very Blessed that the electrical fire did not do any more damage than was done to our building, and most importantly, that we did not have any injuries.

The Administrative Board had already had several discussions in the last few months on the conditions of our air conditioning and heating services and had come to the realization that our HVAC units would need to be replaced. We have used the units up that we have had for over 20 years and some are obsolete and some are just not working at all. We were aware that something would need to be done. With the electrical issues fixed, this has actually taken a big step in proceeding with what we would have had to do anyway.

We are hoping, and have been in prayer, to address the following items:

- Replace the 1 unit that serves the Sanctuary building
- Replace the unit that serves the offices
- Replacing & upgrading the units that serve the main & upper floors of the Education Building
- Adding AC (now using window units that are very old.
- Adding a unit that will help keep the main entry in the Education Build more climate controlled.

We decided to tackle this as 1 big project rather than one at a time because all of it is necessary and we could get the best deal by doing everything at once. We have been in contact with several companies and banks looking at contracts and loans. Needless to say, this is a very big project, but one that is definitely needed.

As the Board moves forward with this project, please be in prayer for God's grace and wisdom to be with us and make the best decisions possible. Also, please be in prayer with how you would like to be involved in this exciting project to help our church family and our wonderful building. I myself am so excited to be able to help bring the church building up to a more modern, safe place for our families. I know it has been very cold in the Sanctuary as well as the nursery, Sunday School rooms, bathrooms, etc., and I am happy to be involved in bringing about a change or fix for this. Even guests to our church will be able to see a huge difference. We also know that this is a huge undertaking but necessary for our church family to be able to continue to worship God and continue our mission of making more disciples for Christ.

Thank you so much for your support of this project. We on your Administrative Board are excited about this project and the importance of keeping our very historic building in good shape and available to all who come for many years to come.


